#### Climate

The south coast of England is known to have one of the warmest climates in the UK, but the weather can still be unpredictable, so it's a good idea to carry a light waterproof jacket or umbrella. It is quite possible for the weather to be warm, cold, sunny, raining, and windy... all in the same day!

#### Money

The currency in Brighton, as in the rest of the United Kingdom, is the British Pound Sterling (£/GBP).

#### **Telephone Country Code**

The telephone country code for the United Kingdom, including Brighton, is +44.

### **Electricity**

230 V; 50Hz - 3-pin

#### Tap water

Tap water in Brighton is safe to drink, unless there's a sign to the contrary (eg on trains), meeting strict health and safety regulations set by the UK government.

#### **Transportation**

Transportation within Brighton is well-developed, featuring various options for getting around. The city has an extensive bus network operated by several companies. Additionally, cycling is popular due to dedicated bike lanes.

#### **Public Transport Info**

Brighton's public transport network is primarily managed by Brighton & Hove Buses, with frequent services running throughout the city and to nearby areas. Student passes and day tickets are available, making travel more affordable and accessible.

#### **Legal Driving Age**

The legal driving age in the UK is 17 years old. Most car hire companies require that you be at least 21 years old and have an international or European driving license.

#### **Alcohol Age**

The legal drinking age in England is 18 years old. You must be at least this age to purchase alcohol or enter licensed premises. Many places will ask for identification if you look below the age of 21.

#### **Smoking Laws**

Smoking is not allowed in enclosed public spaces, including bars, restaurants, and public transport in the UK. Designated smoking areas are usually available outside such establishments. The minimum age for purchasing cigarettes or tobacco products is 18.

#### Insurance

Students must have adequate health, accident and travel insurance while attending any of our programmes.
