



## About

**This is a non-profit organisation set up with three overriding goals:**

1. To encourage and provide opportunities for the Hout Bay communities to come together.
2. To get kids off the streets and develop them through mentorship and coaching to improve life skills, schoolwork & football ability, while creating jobs for players and the broader community.
3. To develop a successful top class football culture and teams which bring pride to the people of Hout Bay.

Apart from operating boys and girls football teams from U6 to adult, in both local and high-performance leagues, they also operate many community initiatives.

## What will you do?

Unpaid internships and volunteer duties in various projects. Volunteers are mainly from Western Europe and the USA currently. Volunteers are matched to one or more projects offered in Hout Bay or the broader Cape Town area, taking into account the needs and abilities of the volunteers.

Volunteers must be at least 20 years old and you will work together with our local teachers and other volunteers. The minimum length of stay is 4 weeks.



### Daily duties may include

- Fitness or Conditioning coaching - Sports coaching (football, basketball, boxing, cricket, sports science)
- Office administration and support
- Social media and website development
- Tutoring and academic support
- Working with social programmes such as aftercares and orphanages

Our volunteers are utilised for a wide range of tasks, from coaching to teaching or administrative duties, and are given a great deal of responsibility. A passion for football is a definite plus. The choice of which age groups and genders you would like to work with is given to you, should you want to get involved in coaching our football teams.

### What to wear?

Comfortable / Sport like clothing.

### Accommodation and meals

Comfortable and safe accommodation with a host family or volunteer residence in Hout Bay. You share the accommodation with other volunteers, and potentially with players from our football teams.

The volunteer residence offers twin to 4-bed accommodation and includes a communal kitchen, lounge, garden and braai (BBQ) area. Bathrooms are shared.

## Which transfers are included?

## Vaccinations

Consult your local doctor/travel clinic.

No vaccinations are required by South Africa. However, a yellow fever certificate is compulsory for those persons who have travelled from, or intend on travelling through countries in the yellow fever belt:

- Africa: Angola, Burundi, Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo, Democratic Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Ethiopia, Gambia, Gabon, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Ghana, Ivory Coast, Kenya, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Rwanda, Tanzania, Togo, Uganda.
- South America: Bolivia, Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, French Guyana, Guyana, Panama, Peru, Surinam, Venezuela, Argentina and Paraguay.

Most countries recommend the following vaccinations for South Africa: DTP vaccine and Hepatitis A vaccine.

Please consult your own doctor for the recommended vaccinations for South Africa. For travellers going to the north-eastern areas of South Africa, anti-malaria precautions are recommended. It is important to keep in mind at all times that HIV and Aids are widespread diseases in South Africa.
